TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR)

The UN Women, Kosovo is implementing a joint UN inter-agency project "Countering the deepening of pre-existing inequalities in Kosovo through COVID-19 by assisting Kosovo's non-majority communities and domestic violence survivors", a project funded by the United Nations (UN) COVID-19 Response and Recovery Multi-Partner Trust Fund (COVID-19 MPTF). In order to mitigate the socioeconomic impact caused by the pandemics, through distribution of working tools to shelter homes for survivors of domestic violence (DV) and gender based violence (GBV), the project activity will enable the shelter residents to generate personal income with a view of facilitating their social integration and economic position. The purpose of this needs assessment is to improve the performance of all shelters in Kosovo through synthesizing information gathered from interviews regarding their needs and challenges, into practical activities and working tools for shelter homes in order to achieve the desired result, which is economic empowerment and social reintegration of DV and GBV survivors in Kosovo shelters.

Amid the coronavirus pandemics when the whole world was in a lockdown mode, a number of isolation measures were also imposed in Kosovo, including the closure of schools and private businesses, as well as limitation of citizens' movement. Based on the reports by Kosovo police, incidents of domestic violence in Kosovo amplified, whereby the reported cases of DV has increased by 30% compared to the same period in 2019. Shelters for protection of domestic violence survivors have also encountered 1 an increased demand for placement of survivors including women survivors and their children, for which they lacked resources to provide a sustainable solution for survivor's economic independence and their social re-integration. Through addressing the emergent needs of DV and GBV survivors, as a particular group, this needs assessments will be used to inform successful delivery of the project for the next phase while enabling to prioritize the setting for supplying shelter homes with working tools that would generate personal incomes for shelter residents, encourage their creative and innovative thinking, enhance lives in shelters, as well as offer them social re-integration.

The pandemics with Covid-19 not only affected the level of domestic violence but also increased shelter needs for financial resources and assets. For these reasons and many more, ultimately the report provides a number of recommendations for various stakeholders to take into account when planning or implementing a response to ensure that the needs of the most affected groups are met.
